Conference History

The Christian Schools Athletic Conference formed sometime in the late 1990s. At least 15 schools held membership in the conference at some time ranging in location from Kokomo in the north to Seymour in the south. The hub was Indianapolis with as many as seven schools representing the capital city.

Regular season and conference tournament champions are known only for a handful of seasons. Two of the most successful programs from 2001 to 2005 were Columbus Christian and Kokomo Christian. The Crusaders won at least two regular-season titles and a conference tournament crown while the Kingsmen grabbed two tourney championships.

Based on Kokomo Christian closing its high school in 2006 and Columbus Christian becoming an independent the following season, it is believed that the last year for the conference was 2005-2006. Although the conference is gone, the CSAC has left a legacy in the Indiana Christian Schools Athletic Association (ICSAA) which the conference helped start in 1999. Columbus Christian and Horizon Christian continue to play in the ICSAA state tournament. Columbus captured the title in 2003 and 2014 with Horizon the 2013 winners.
