Conference History

The Michiana Christian Athletic Conference (MCAC) began in 1975-76, Elkhart Baptist's second varsity season. The other Indiana school was Brethren Christian, recently of the defunct Midwest Christian Conference. These two schools were joined by two Michigan schools, Grand Rapids Baptist and New Hope Christian. Grand Rapids Baptist and New Hope Christian lasted just one season and were replaced in 1976 by a new school, Fort Wayne Christian, and Quincy Faith Christian of Michigan.

During the MCAC's short run, conference schools competed in a round-robin schedule and a conference tournament each year. Brethren Christian posted the best season with an undefeated regular season and conference tournament performance in 1976-77. The Chargers would continue their string before losing in the Midwest Christian Invitational championship in March to finish the season with a 27-1 mark.

After just three seasons, the conference folded following the 1977-78 season. Brethren Christian, Elkhart Baptist and Fort Wayne Christian were not independent for long as they joined two other schools to form the Northern Indiana Christian Athletic League starting in 1978-79.
