Conference History

According to the Times of Northwest Indiana, five Christian schools formed the Northwest Hoosier Christian Conference (NHCC) in 1991. The teams first competed against each other in the NHCC Tip-off on November 23, 1991 at Market Square Arena in Indianapolis prior to the Indiana Pacers home game. No scores are available from that round-robin event.

In the conference's two years of existence Calumet Baptist came away with both regular-season NHCC conference titles. The Patriots finished 6-0 both years. Heritage Christian of Hammond was 4-2 in 1992-93. All five schools were also members of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) Indiana state tournament. Portage Christian won the Division II crown in 1993.

After just two years, the Northwest Hoosier Christian Conference appears to have folded following the 1992-1993 season. No varsity basketball records can be found for Heritage Christian or Maranatha Christian after 1993. The conference is not mentioned in The Times past 1993. Calumet and Portage would remain independents until 2010 when they joined the South Shore Christian Conference. South Haven did not join a conference again before discontinuing varsity sports in the mid-2000s.
