Conference History

The Three Rivers Athletic Conference (TRAC) of southern Indiana included five or six members each year from 1979-1989. Three Christian schools participated in the TRAC. Mill Road Christian helped charter the conference while Graceland Christian joined when the school opened in 1981-82 with Evansville Christian voted in for the 1982-83 season. Graceland was an IHSAA school. Other IHSAA members in the conference were Cannelton, Evansville Day, Medora and New Harmony.

Of the four private schools, only Graceland Christian (now Christian Academy of Indiana) had much success, winning regular-season titles in 1983, 1987, 1988 and 1989. According to available records, Evansville Day and Evansville Christian never won more than two conference games. Mill Road Christian may not have won a TRAC game before leaving the conference after the 1981-82 season.

Although Evansville Day entered the TRAC as an IHSAA member, the Eagles played as an independent from 1981-1987. During that time, Evansville Christian joined the IHSAA from 1981-1986 but left for the Indiana Christian Athletic Association (ICAA) in 1986-87. Mill Road Christian had preceded the Golden Eagles by joining the Indiana Association of Christian Schools (IACS) in 1982-83. Mill Road closed in 1985 and Evansville Christian shut down its high school in 1991. According to Wikipedia, the Three Rivers Athletic Conference folded in 1989 "due to travel concerns." The remaining schools continue as IHSAA independents except New Harmony, which closed its doors in 2012.
